8 KEY CHANGES

- Use of Annex SL structure
- Incorporation of some OEM customer-specific requirements
- Enhancement of product traceability requirements
- Inclusion of requirements for products with embedded software requirements
- Clarification of sub-tier supplier management and development requirements
- Inclusion of a Warranty Management Process for No Trouble Found (NTF) and the use of automotive industry guidance
- Inclusion of requirements for safety related parts and processes
- Adoption of corporate responsibility requirements
