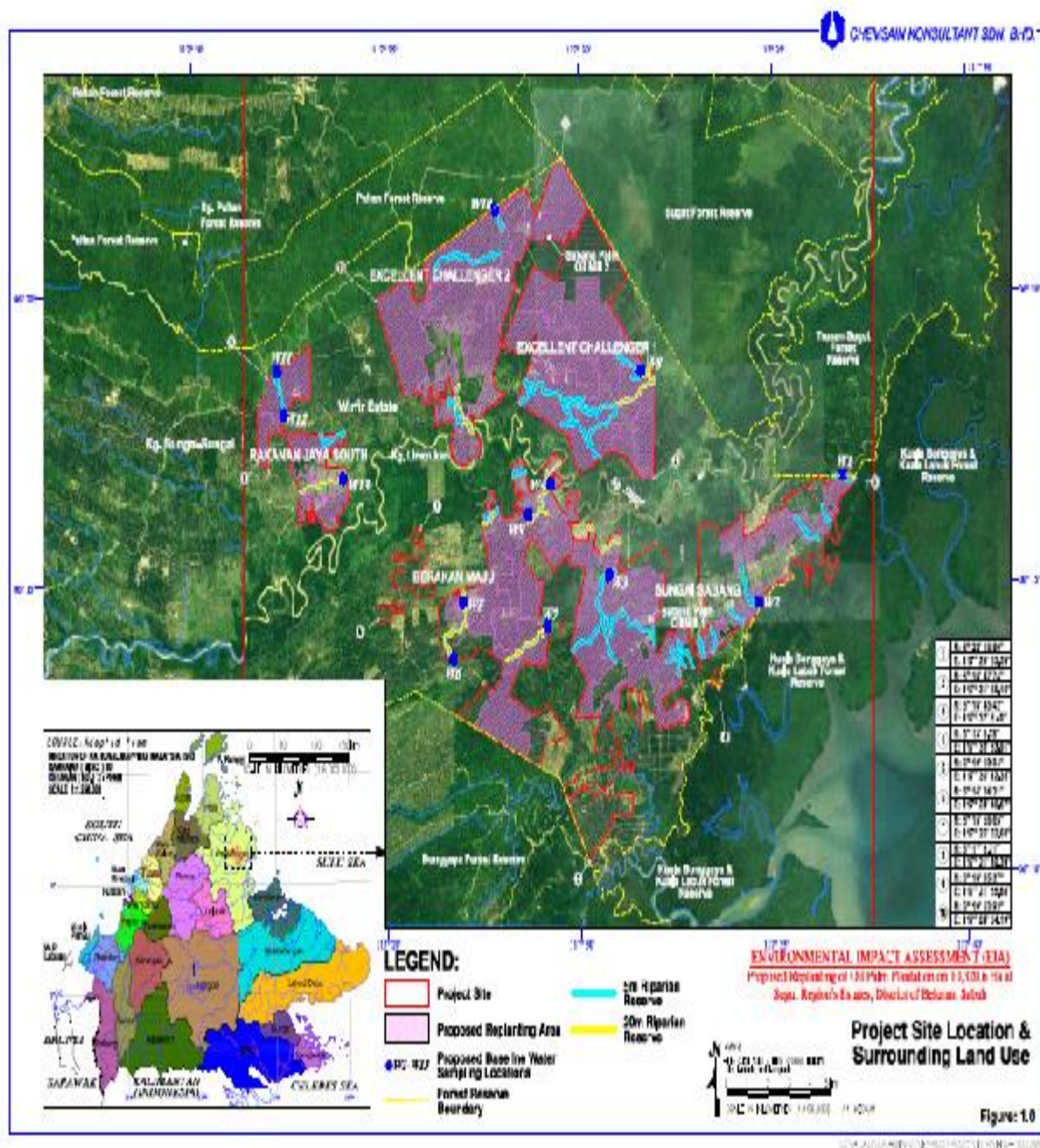

Stakeholder consultation took place in the form of interviews. Due to this is the main assessment, meetings with workers were held in their respective premises within and near the estates and mill. In all the interviews and meetings the purpose of the audit was clarified at the outset followed by an evaluation of the relationship between the stakeholder and the company before discussions proceeded in accordance with relevant MSPO principles, criteria and indicators. 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Further verified the training conducted for manurer titled “Taklimat Penggunaan PPE & Cara Pembajaan” dated 2nd April 2018. When further interviewed manurers, the interviewees managed to demonstrate proper way of using PPE.

EC 2 Estate

Sighted audit plan established from the documentation. The latest available audit plan was for the month of October 2017. Based on the Internal Audit Manual established, the operating unit will be audited by identified internal auditors at least once a year. The next internal audit will be conducted in October 2018.

All the internal auditors have been trained by consultant namely Biz Excellence System.

Noted that the Internal Audit has been conducted on 13th October 2018 by the appointed Internal Auditors. Based on the internal audit records, the audit team observed that several NCs has been identified. The root cause of the NCs has been addressed by the company within the Internal Audit Report that is dated 20th October 2017 and has been presented to the auditor during the audit.

Sampled NC: 1

Regarding training program for 2017 was not available.

Further verified the training program for 2018 was made available and trainings have been conducted as per program.

Minat Teguh Estate

IJM Plantation has a plan to conduct internal audit covering MSPO requirements once a year in future. The audit will be conducted by Sustainability Team. The team is evidence in Sustainability Management Team for Minat Teguh Estate organization chart.

Based on records, the audit team notes that the company has established proper internal audit plan that is found to be covering all operations within the estates. The audit team notes that the Internal Audit has been conducted on 29 January 2018 by the appointed Internal Auditors. Based on the internal audit records, the audit team observed that 11 NCs has been identified. The root cause of the NCs has been addressed by the company within the Internal Audit Report that is dated before within Feb & March 2018 and has been presented to the auditor during the audit. Only 1 remains on the construction of chemical store supposed to be completed by 30/4/2018 but still ongoing. Expected to complete by June 2018.

Internal Audit has been reviewed during the Management Review Meeting on 17th October 2017 and has been attended by the top management of the estate. Among issues discussed is internal audit report following the audit conducted on 11th October 2017 pertaining to issues such as

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continuous suitability, adequacy and effectiveness of the requirements for effective implementation of MSPO and decide on any changes, improvement and modification. The meeting minute was later verified by the Estate Manager, Mr. Janai Bin Ahmad.

EC 2 Estate

Internal Audit has been reviewed during the Management Review Meeting on 25th October 2017 and has been attended by the top management of the estate. Among issues discussed is internal audit report following the audit conducted on 13th October 2017 pertaining to issues such as continuous suitability, adequacy and effectiveness of the requirements for effective implementation of MSPO and decide on any changes, improvement and modification. The meeting minute was later verified by the Estate Manager, Mr. Lee Wei Ming.

Minat Teguh Estate

Internal Audit has been reviewed during the Management Review Meeting on 2 February 2018 and has been attended by the top management of the estate. Among issues discussed is internal audit report following the audit conducted on 29 January 2018; pertaining to issues such as continuous suitability, adequacy and effectiveness of the requirements for effective implementation of MSPO and decide on any changes, improvement and modification.

This was sighted in Block 13 where palm were marked red and 2 palms rows are maintained.

Signage's were also erected to ensure workers were aware of the buffer zone.

Minat Teguh Estate

Treated water was tested at least once a year. Latest report dated 28th February 2018 indicated the treated water complied with the standard.

Regular monitoring of water quality at the stream/river flowing through the plantation conducted every 6 months. Verified few of the environmental monitoring & compliance audit report (CK/MO411/810-1/18) dated 21st March 2018. All parameters tested were within permissible limit.

Rain water harvesting through is implemented at every household for domestic use.

For the riparian reserve that has already been planted with oil palm trees, the existing oil palm retained to avoid river bank erosion. All riparian are demarcated with red paint and mapped out. No spraying is allowed at the riparian reserve. Onsite visit confirmed no spraying activities along the riparian zone.

Natural vegetation is observed along the riparian.

No well use in the estate.

Water reservoir is well maintain in Minat Teguh Estate

It was identified that river buffer and signboard

Status of rare, threatened or endangered species and high biodiversity value area

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EC I & 2 Estates

IJMPB Sugut Region estate audited EC I and EC II has in their maps of planted area and the wider landscape level consideration has identified areas and boundary that borders the neighbouring Forest Reserve Paitan and Forest Reserve Sugut .

There are no high biodiversity value habitats, such as rare and threatened ecosystems, that could be significantly affected by the grower(s) activities within the estate EC I and EC II .

Similarly there are no conservation status (e.g. The International Union on Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN) status on legal protection, population status and habitat requirements of rare, threatened, or endangered species), within the estates EC I and EC I2

Minat Teguh Estate

Water catchment area has been established within the estates which supply raw water to the main water tank.

Forest boundary with Sepilok Forest Reserve are visual seen and signboard to inform 'Kawasan Rizab Hutan' was erected at several site.

Assessment of biodiversity was identified in the estate Environment Management Plan developed by IJM sustainability team dated 15th January 2018.

Zero burning practices

EC I & 2 Estates

The company is committed to the zero burning approach during disposal; or preparing land for oil palm cultivation (replanting) as clearly stated in 'Bab 03: Pelan Pengurusan Udara' of 'Pelan Pengurusan Alam Sekitar'. This is stated in 3.1 Polisi Sifar Pembakaran Terbuka

In the latest Sustainability Policy June 2018 , it is stated that IJMPB will 'adopt no burning policy in the new planting and replanting activities ' .

At EC I, there were evidence of some burning of waste sighted on the ground at the school bus-stop beside the diesel skid tank.

Minat Teguh Estate

Zero burning policy is adopted for Minat Teguh Estates in all land clearing sites and housing areas.

In the IJM Plantation Groups Plantation Manual (3rd Revision 2008/2009), clause 3.2.1.4 stated burning should be avoided unless necessary. Prior approval must be obtained from the DOE.

Signboards of zero burning observed during onsite audit. Inspections of replanting area show that old stands of palm had been felled, chipped and

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retained in windrows as mulch and the use of fire was not found during replanting activities.

Major 3 : 4.5.3.2

A waste management plan to avoid or reduce pollution has been developed by Minat Teguh Estate, however it was found not fully implemented.

1. Findings at Minat Teguh Dumping Site

Waste segregation at source is not implemented as observed at the landfill which filled with recyclable waste such as paper, plastic and cans. Although recycle bins are available onsite, but the continued disposal of all kind of waste at the landfill indicated the lack of awareness and commitment to implement segregation at source.

2. Findings at Minat Teguh Workshop

It was identified management of used tire are not properly done at the workshop site. Visual assessment found that some tire contain water and there is a potential mosquito breeding at water log in used tire.

Minat Teguh Estate

Sources of waste were identified and categorized with the relevant mitigation measures. It was identified in the Minat teguh Environment management Plan .During Site visit, it was also identified availability of Recycle Bin at workers housing site for recycle programmed implementation.
